## **Guidelines for Entry, Display and Sale of Art**

Entry Fee: \$ 10.00 (cash or check only)

- Two-dimensional work only
- One work per artist
- Maximum size 36 inches height or width
- Work must have been completed within the last three years and NOT have been exhibited previously in any CAL exhibit (excluding Art Associates Gallery Shows)
- Work must either be framed, or museum/gallery wrapped
- Remember to be sure your painting is wired for hanging! No saw tooth or other hangers please!
- Affix entry form below to the back, upper left-hand corner
- Watercolors (except if on canvas), pastels and drawings must be under glass
- Work must be dry
- Artwork must remain on display for the duration of the exhibit
- Original art only
- Sales will be the artist's responsibility. The Pruyn House will provide visitors with a list of works and prices.
- You must be a current CAL member to participate. Please visit our website for a membership form.

# Our Judge for the 2022 Pruyn House Show: Edward Ticson, MA, MFA

After working several years as a freelance commercial artist, Edward pursued graduate studies in drawing and painting at the University of Albany where he received his Master of Arts in 1997 and his Master of Fine Arts in 1999. Since graduating, he has been teaching extensively as an adjunct professor for Siena College. Edward has also taught for the Sage Colleges of Albany, Empire State College, The College of St. Rose, and was the first department chair in Drawing and Painting for The Arts Center of the Capital Region.

Edward has also taught figure drawing for Vicarious Visions, a large video game studio located in the Albany region. He collaborates with the Albany Art Room where he has taught several classes, and in 2019, served as the Art Director for Art Abroad where he taught plein air painting to students throughout the Netherlands. He is currently leading and instructing an artists' group known as the Artists of Studio 76 and has explored teaching art online through the current pandemic.

Edward has served as a teacher, judge, guest lecturer, panelist, and curator in collaboration with organizations such as the Museum of Modern Art, the Albany Institute of History and Art, the New York State Museum, the New York State Olympics of the Visual Arts, the Fulton Street Gallery, The Bethlehem Art Association, the Colonie Art League, and other local art groups.

In his many years of teaching, Edward has had the experience of working with artists at every experience level in a variety of disciplines. Having taught both young children to adults, he enjoys teaching everything from beginning drawing to mentoring other fellow professional artists.

The Ed Ticson Workshop was held on February 11 and was a great success. He focused on basic portrait and figure drawing integrated with a slide presentation of the masters, and we're happy to say Ed will be demonstrating for us at the May meeting.







# **Eden Compton Workshop**

Tuesday, March 14 (Snow date March 28)

"Color and Composition II" covers the basic principles of landscape and still life composition and color theory and how to apply both to our own work. The goal is to

help the student become less reliant on their references (photo or life) and view them as the starting point to create dynamic and expressive paintings.

This class will build on the first Color and Composition workshops, but it is not necessary to have taken either of the previous classes as we will review the basic principles of color, value, design, and composition before starting the exercises and assignments. We will work initially with notans and value maps to explore multiple compositional ideas that can then be developed into complete paintings. This portion will explore Edgar Payne's classic compositional armatures in more depth than the previous class. We will then cover the basics of color mixing and color harmony to create unique and expressive color schemes for the afternoon painting assignment. (Eden prefers gouache for this workshop, but you may work in any medium.)
