Show Time

When the curtain is pulled back on a play, we are transfixed by what changed a stage into a production. The same thing occurs in our CAL shows. We start 3 - 4 months in advance to select the dates and coordinate with the local staff.

We seek the names of potential judges and then make contact to explain what we expect, and the dates of the event. We ask judges to also be on hand at our reception to award prizes and talk about chosen pieces.

The next step in the process is identifying what items are needed for the show. This year we purchased new and improved wall hangers, new easel stands, banners and signs.

Several months before the event, we begin reaching out to the membership for volunteers. Our members always come through! At intake time, we set up tables and signage, get snacks and food to keep our volunteers' energy up and make sure everyone knows their job. When the doors open for the intake, we are thrilled to see and accept all our members' wonderful works of art that will make up the show.

Just before we hang the artwork, we pay our webmaster, **Richard Ruotolo**, to photograph each piece and create an online version of the show. Member volunteers then help to hang the show and, typically several days later, we host the reception. Again, our volunteers help by decorating the tables for the reception. We purchase tablecloths, decorations and plants or flowers and get the prize monies and awards ready.

There is about a month or so before we start thinking about our next show. As with any all-volunteer organizations, our shows couldn't happen without the support of the Board and our membership. Thank you.
