

Guidelines for Entry, Display and Sale of Art For the CAL Summer 2023 Show at the Guilderland Public Library

Entry Fee: \$ 10.00 (cash or check only)

- Two-dimensional work only
- One work per artist/CAL member
- Maximum size 24 inches height or width (including outside dimensions of frame)

- Work must have been completed within the last three years and NOT have been exhibited previously in any CAL exhibit (excluding Art Associates Gallery Shows)
- Work must either be framed, or museum/gallery wrapped
- Remember to be sure your painting is wired for hanging! No saw tooth or other hangers please
- Affix entry form below to the back, upper left-hand corner
- Watercolors (except if on canvas), pastels and drawings must be under glass
- Work must be dry
- Artwork must remain on display for the duration of the exhibit
- Original art only
- Sales will be the artist's responsibility
- You must be a current CAL member to participate. Please visit our website for a membership form.
